

Governor reaffirms commitment to building up transportation Infrastructure

OAK BROOK – Gov. Bruce Rauner today reaffirmed his commitment to the state's transportation industry in a speech at the Illinois Road and Transportation Builders Association Conference. The meeting was devoted to innovative project delivery methods in Illinois.

"The Illinois Road and Transportation Builders Association is the key to prosperity for Illinois," said Gov. Rauner. "Our whole economic engine of job creation and economic growth is dependent on you because we are the transportation hub of America. Our transportation network needs to be the best in the world. In 2016, the Illinois Department of Transportation completed more than 700 highway projects, ranging from routine resurfacings to major, multi-year reconstructions.
