

First Assistant State's Attorney Crystal Uhe Receives Fourth Endorsement From Major Police Union

EDWARDSVILLE - First Assistant State's Attorney Crystal Uhe has received her fourth endorsement from another major police union in Madison County.

Edwardsville Police Department Fraternal Order of Police #244 voted "overwhelmingly" to endorse Crystal Uhe for State's Attorney recognizing her fifteen

years of prosecuting cases in Madison County. Uhe has also been endorsed by the Madison County Sheriff's Office, Alton Police Department, and Granite City Police Department PB&PAs, the three largest police departments in the county.
