The Illinois Attorney General's Office said financial scams often go unreported or can be difficult to prosecute, so they're considered a "low-risk" crime. However, they are devastating to many older adults and can leave them in a very vulnerable position with little time to recoup their losses. "The Attorney General protects the rights and safety of Illinois' older residents who often are targeted by scam artists and abusers. The office can assist with special needs of all the residents, including those related to consumer fraud, healthcare abuse and neglect, financial exploitation, and veterans' rights.
