


Art on the Square Uses Grant to Purchase Unique Sculpture for the St. Clair County Historical Society

BELLEVILLE – In connection with a matching grant from The National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), Art on the Square has purchased an 8' sculpture titled "Flame" from sculptor Ron Stinson. The sculpture will be installed at the St. Clair County Historical Society's Daphne Sumner History Discovery Center, located at 705 East Washington St. Belleville. This abstract piece of art can be displayed both indoors and outdoors and is made of Marine Quality Stainless Steel.
