THE STORY OF DECOYS

Bird decoys are a beautiful and primary folk art, originating in North America. They were first fashioned by Native American hunter-artists over 1,000 years ago. Creating a decoy demands keen knowledge, appreciation, and understanding of all things "bird" by the carver, who creates the bird's form, feather, and color by hand.

A great decoy looks and floats like a real bird. It mimics the poses and behavior of real bird. As such, hunters have long relied on these indispensable partners on a good hunt. Likewise, collectors admire and delight in the workmanship, skill, tradition, and history which each treasured decoy represents. The sportsman, the artist, the birder, the conservationist and the wildlife biologist are equally moved by the wonders of wildlife on the great Mississippi Flyway.
