Dear Representative Riley:

As you are aware, Governor Rauner has proposed a series of changes to the state procurement process. I agree with the governor that we may generate savings for the state through procurement changes, and I would like to work to enact reasonable measures that reduce the cost of state government while protecting transparency and ethical conduct in all contracting decisions.

I would request that the State Government Administration Committee begin immediate consideration of the governor's proposals. In doing so, I would ask the Committee to:

- Evaluate ways to streamline the current structure to improve the procurement process;
- Analyze and determine whether there is a need for the current structure, which includes Chief Procurement Officers, State Purchasing Officers, Procurement Monitors, and the Procurement Policy Board;
- Examine whether current law provides sufficient protections to ensure ethical procurements and avoid alleged conflicts of interest, and if those protections adequately protect the taxpayers or serve as a deterrent to the procurement process;
- Conclude whether the law should be amended to address needs and duties of certain agencies or institutions.
- Determine if joint purchasing agreements would be beneficial to the State and local governments.
