




Paul Trickey

Paul E. Trickey, 91, formerly of Wood River, passed away at 12 midnight on Friday, June 12, 2015, at Eunice Smith Nursing Home in Alton. He was born on August 14, 1923, in Cape Girardeau, Missouri, the son of the late Linley and Cora (Steinhoff) Trickey.
