Herschel Dean Coleson, Sr., 67, formerly of Jerseyville and Grafton, passed away at 6: 30pm on Thursday, September 3, 2015, at Alton Memorial Hospital, following an extended illness. He was born on May 31, 1948, in Olive Branch, Illinois, the son of the late Lloyd and Ruby Bell (Harp) Coleson. A U.S. Army veteran, he had been employed as a department store assistant manager and was a customer service clerk for Money Time Check Cashers and Pawn in Cape Girardeau, Mo. He owned and operated The Tackle Box in Olive Branch. For many years he was a licensed minister with the Assemblies of God, during which time he helped with youth, children's and nursing home ministries.

A member of Trinity Assembly of God Church in Olive Branch, he also became a member of the Grafton Full Gospel Church, where he had attended for the past four years since relocating to Jersey County. He attended the First Assembly of God Church in East Alton since moving to Alton last February.

On June 10, 1967, in St. Louis, Missouri, he married Wendy K. Jones and she survives.
