Bruce Wayne Isringhausen, 57, died at 5:51 p.m., Sunday, October 11, 2015 at St. Anthony's Hospital in Alton, after an 18 month battle with T Cell Lymphoma. He was born in Jerseyville on April 18, 1958, the youngest of five children born to Floyd & Virginia (Winchell) Isringhausen. Bruce attended Jersey Community High School, and was employed as a truck driver for his adult life. He owned and operated Bruce Isringhausen Trucking for many years, and made many friends all over the country along the way.
