


## Charles Erwin

Charles Stuart Erwin, 74, died at 1:15 a.m., Sunday, December 6, 2015 at his residence. He was born in Jerseyville on Feb. 2, 1941, the son of Floyd & Irene (Foster) Erwin. He was a 1959 graduate of Jersey Community High School, and served with the U.S. Army in South Vietnam during the war.
