Anthony "Tony" Carey, 67, died at 10:40 a.m., Friday, January 1, 2016 at his residence after a short battle with lung cancer. He was born in St. Josephs Hospital in Alton on Oct. 4, 1948, and was one of three sons born to Vincent Girard & Florence Mae (Jakulski) Carey. He graduated with the Class of 1966 from Jersey Community High School, and attended Quincy University before being drafted with the U.S. Army serving in Germany during the Vietnam War. Tony was a devoted family man, a loving husband and father, as well as active grandpa. He had a passion for baseball as a player, fan and coach, and enjoyed many years coaching with the Grafton Khoury League and most recently with the 14U Calhoun Crush traveling baseball team. An
