He was born in Jerseyville on December 10, 1984, one of three children born to Max Douglas & Susan Diane (Meuth) Dixon. Eric was blessed to be a part of a loving and supportive family, and he returned those blessings to them as well in ways that can not be measured. He attended St. Francis/Holy Ghost Catholic Schools and graduated in 2003 from Jersey Community High School in Jerseyville, where he was a standout, three sport athlete, participating in basketball, baseball, and football. He attended Lewis & Clark Community College in Godfrey on a baseball scholarship and received his Associates Degree. He then went on to attend Southeast Missouri State University in Cape Girardeau, Mo., and transferred to Logan College of Chiropractic where he finished his Bachelors in Human Biology Deciding to follow his love of sports, he simultaneously received his Master of Sport Science and Rehabilitation in addition to his Doctorate of Chiropractic. In August and December of 2011, Dr. Dixon received his Doctorate of Chiropractic and his Master of

He strived be the best son, brother, grandson, nephew, cousin and friend that he could be, and took genuine pride in seeing other individuals succeed in both fitness and health, as well as their personal lives. He was very honored and excited to have been recently invited to be part of the Chiropractic team for the St. Louis Cardinals.
