

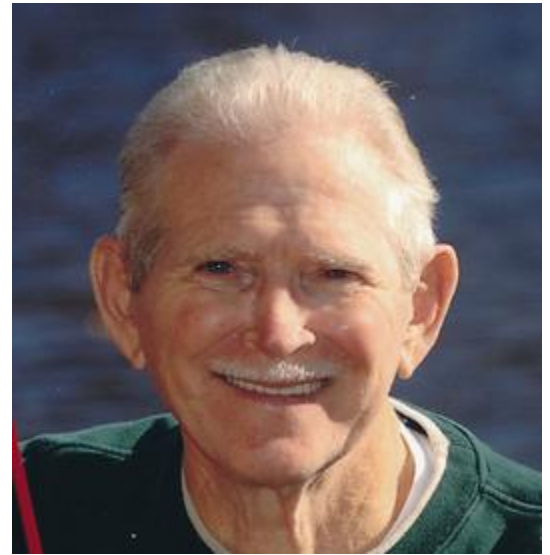


Albert Heflin
