Ruth Elizabeth Harms Nickols, 96, of Chautauqua Illinois, formerly of Lincoln, Illinois, died peacefully on February 23, 2017, at her home in Chautauqua.

She was born on November 27, 1920, in Washburn, Illinois to Gerhardt H. and Anna Meta Harms. She married Daniel F. Nickols, Jr. of Lincoln, IL in 1943. He preceded her in death in 1983.
