Charles Edwin Ducey, 87 of Hardin, died May 24, 2017, at Jerseyville Nursing and Rehab Center, surrounded by family.

Charles was born on April 28, 1930 in Pittsfield IL, the son of Edwin James Ducey and Helen Marguerite (Hassett) Ducey. They preceded him in death. He was married to Carol Sue (Huber) Ducey until her passing in May of 1998. Also, preceding him in death was a brother Patrick Ducey and Sister in Law Patty Ducey.
