Charles Henry Lackman, 88, died at 2:35 a.m., Sunday, January 7, 2018 at Jerseyville Manor Nursing Home. He was born in Greenfield, Illinois on Aug. 15, 1929, one of three children born to Charles and Jennie (Buck) Lackman. His careers throughout his adult life always involved interaction with people, of which he gained much enjoyment. He always possessed a smile, firm handshake, a good story and his solid word, regardless of his involvement. He first began working as a driver for Colonial Bread Company, which led him to his position as a sales rep for Moorman Feed out of Quincy, IL. It was there that he came in contact with many area farmers, who became life long friends. After his retirement, he continued to brighten the days of many, serving as a sales clerk at Norton's Hardware in Jerseyville. He married the former Evelyn June Anderson on Aug. 16, 1952 at Our Saviour Catholic Church in Jacksonville, and together they were blessed with nearly 64 years together before her death on July 8, 2016.
