Clyde (Cobb) V. Miller, passed away on Wednesday, February 14, 2018 at 6:15 p.m. at Cedarhurst of Bethalto with his family at his side. Mr. Miller was a lifelong resident of Fosterburg until his recent move to Bethalto.

He was born on May 15, 1925 in Fosterburg to Joe and Nell (Gray) Miller.

Mr. Miller served in the US Navy during WWII on the PC1120, serving most of his time in the Pacific. Miller was employed at Olin Corporation for 40 years, retiring in 1990. He was a lifetime member of the Alton VFW post 1308 and was a member of the Fosterburg Cemetery Association for many years. In his spare time he enjoyed gardening, hunting, trap shooting and sports.
