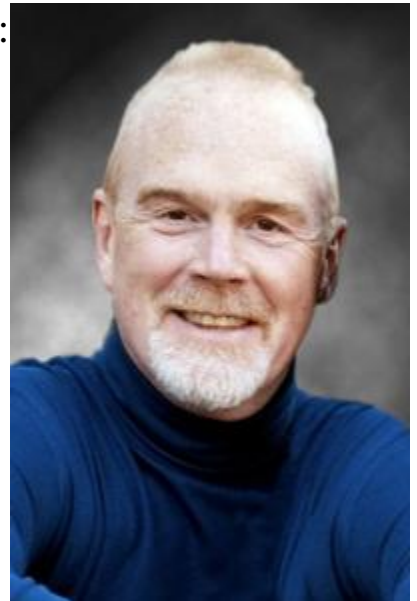




Scott Ward
