Clarence Austell "Jack" Dempsey Jr., 83, of Edwardsville, Illinois passed away at 9:11 a.m. on Saturday, August 18, 2018 at Evelyn's House in Creve Coeur, Missouri. He was born December 24, 1934 in Jackson, Mississippi, a son of the late Clarence Austell and Emma Ellen (Byrum) Dempsey Jr. He married Donna (Hooker) Dempsey on February 19, 1975 in Las Vegas, Nevada and she survives.

Since 1955, he was an owner and operator of Dempsey Adams Auto Body and Granite City Glass and Fence Company. Jack had served the United States for six years with the Missouri Army National Guard. He was a dedicated member of Masonic Triple Lodge #835 in Granite City and
