Reverend James T. "J.T." Kelly, 74, of Kincaid, IL, passed away on Wednesday, September 12, 2018 in Springfield, IL.

J.T. was born on January 28, 1944, in Eldorado, IL, the son of Loyd and Effie (Johnston) Kelly. He married June Garrett in East Alton, on February 8, 1969.

He obtained his Associates Degree at the University of Kentucky then attended SIUE. He completed Theology Studies at Lee University in Cleveland, Tennessee. J.T. held an Ordained Bishop License, served his church as an Evangelist during his early years, serving a total of 50 years, for the Church of God. His former Church of God pastorates include, Brookport,
