Eileen Murphy Dunn, 95, died at 12:50 p.m., Tuesday August 5, 2008 at St. John's Mercy Medical Center in Creve Coeur after a brief illness.

A native of Charleston S.C., she was the daughter of Richard and Ellen (Flynn) Murphy.

She was a member of Saints Peter & Paul Catholic Church in Alton, and was dedicated to the rosary and to the missions and never missed an opportunity to do works of charity teaching her children by her example never to turn their backs on anyone in need.
