Ewing E. Baldwin, 84, died September 25, 2009 at 10:20 a.m. at Christian Hospital Northeast in St. Louis County. He was born July 2, 1925 in Vandalia, IL, the son of the late Frederick and Olive Baldwin. He served in the U.S. Navy during WWII from November 2, 1943 to January 9, 1946. After over 30 years of service with the United States Postal service, Ewing became a Real Estate Appraiser and was the President of the Southwestern Illinois Chapter NAIFA. After selling his appraisal business, Ewing volunteered with several organizations. Ewing married the former Marlene Ham in Godfrey in 1969 and was married to her for forty years. Ewing often said that "she was the best thing that ever happened to me." In addition to his wife Marlene, he is survived by his son, E.
