Marguerite Edna Murphy, 95, died at 1:08 a.m., Monday, October 5, 2009 at the Willow Rose Rehab & Health Care in Jerseyville. She was born in Randolph County, Mo. on June 19, 1914, and was the daughter of the late Arthur John & Dovie Mae (Stone) Herring. After the death of her mother when Marguerite was just four years old, she was raised by her Stone grandparents. She married Carl Kenneth Murphy on Dec. 31, 1932 in Alton, and he preceded her in death on Sept. 25, 1990 after sharing nearly 58 years together. In her early years, Marguerite worked for the International Shoe Factory, the Western in East Alton, and was a sorter at Reynolds Aluminum in St. Louis. After moving to Jerseyville in 1956, Marguerite remained at home, where she was a dedicated wife and mother, assuming the responsibility of caring for her son, Kenneth after he contracted polio.
