Charles "Ed" Garner, 66, passed away Saturday, November 21, 2009, unexpectedly at home. Born July 18, 1943 in Prescott, Iowa, he was the son of Joseph Ray and Goldie May (Ewart) Garner.



Ed lived on a farm in Iowa growing up and became quite the horseman at an early age, winning many trophies and ribbons throughout his life.
