Ted B. Lawton 87 died at 12:35 pm, Tuesday, December 15, 2009 at St. Anthony's Health Center in Alton, IL.

He was born February 20, 1922 to William Arthur and Irene Marie (Morrison) Lawton, on a farm west of Brighton, IL.

On June 25, 1946 he married the former Ada Graul at the Fosterburg Baptist Church in Fosterburg. She survives.

Ted was employed at the Owens-Illinois Glass Plant on Broadway in Alton, IL. for ten years, and then transferred to the Owens-Illinois Machine Shop in Godfrey, IL. for nine years retiring in 1984.
