Joseph Andrew Johnson, 77, died at 7:00 a.m., Friday, November 26, 2010 at Alton Memorial Hospital in Alton, IL.

A Greene County native, he was born in White Hall on April 22, 1933, and was the son of the late Irwin & Loretta (Beauchamp) Johnson. Joe graduated from Carrollton High School, and served his country with the U.S. Army. He was a longtime member of the
