Mary Diane McFarland, 66, died suddenly at 6:01 p.m, Tuesday, November 30, 2010 in the emergency room at Alton Memorial Hospital. She was born in Aberdeen, SD on June 22, 1944, the only child born to the late Harry & Marion Gail (Stewart) Eisele.

A native of South Dakota, Mary Diane obtained her Masters in Education from South Dakota State University, and thereafter began her lifelong dedication to education. She continued as a guidance counselor for Alton High School for many years, retiring in 2008.
