## Grafton | Wednesday, January 12 2011

James Harold "Jim" DeSherlia, 84, formerly of Grafton, died at 12:20 p.m., Wednesday, January 12, 2011 at Des Peres Hospital with his family by his side.

He was born May 16, 1926 in Grafton, one of thirteen children born to Charles "Cube" and Catherine (Blaine) DeSherlia. Only five out of the thirteen survived until adulthood. He married Lora May Palmer on May 17,



1947 at the First Baptist Church Parsonage in Jerseyville, and together they shared nearly 59 years together before her death on April 21, 2006. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1943 at the age of 17 and served on the light cruiser "The Denver" until November 1-2, 1943, the night it was torpedoed and the next morning attacked by air. He finished out his enlistment on the destroyer "The Montpelier".

He began his career as a chef at the Pere Marquette Lodge in Grafton after his duty in the Navy at the age of 21 and there for 30 years. At that time the lodge was being renovated by the State of Illinois and he moved from Grafton to Jerseyville. It was then, that he & his wife operated the Twilight Inn Tavern in downtown Jerseyville for nine years, until resuming his duties as a chef at the Brass Door Restaraunt in Carrollton for 18 years, where he mad the "all you can eat boneless pork chop night" famous at the restaraunt. He retired in 2004. He was a member of many organizations including the Shriners, Masons, and the Grafton American Legion for over 60 years. He loved bowling each with with his league teams.
