


## Lee Hoffstetter

Lee Edwin Hoffstetter, 83, passed away at his home with his family by his side Sunday morning, March 6, 2011. Lee was born Jan. 25, 1928 in Alton, the son of Ed and Ida (Kohlenberg) Hoffstetter. They both preceded him in death. He began work in 1945 at the Western Cartridge Corp. in East Alton, now known as Olin. He served in the U.S. Army from 1946 until 1949. After that time he was a Staff Sergeant in the U.S. Air Force, where served in Korea as a weather observer. When he was discharged, he returned to work in the Posit Bond Department at Olin Corp. He retired in 1985 after 40 years of service. He married Barbara Marie Kopsie in 1951. She also preceded him in death in 2003.
