Rev. Gordon Dean Cox, 76, died at 3:00 a.m., Thursday July 21, 2011 at his residence with his family at his side.

He was born in Greene County on Nov. 5, 1934 the ninth of twelve children born to the late William "Button" and Maude (White) Cox.



He was a U.S. Army veteran, and was a meat cutter by trade, as well as a carpenter, building numerous homes in the area. His heart belonged to the Lord, and he was an evangelist speaking at numerous venues throughout the country, and founded the New Life Tabernacle in Delhi in 1982, and built the church from the ground up, serving the Lord and his congregation for the past 29 years until his failing health prevented him from doing so.

He enjoyed anything outdoors, whether it was hunting or fishing, but most enjoyed his family and spoiling his grandchildren.

He married the former Barbara Joann McAdams at the United Methodist Parsonage in Jerseyville on Nov. 1, 1958, and together they have shared nearly 53 years together.

2003; five sisters, Audrey Platto, Eula McKinnon, Frances Akers, Clover Miller, and Wanda Ruyle; and five brothers, Courtland, Lowell "Phizz", Herschel, Beverly "Pete", and Rev. William Cox.
