Ronald Thomas Roth, 77, died at 6:50 p.m. Thursday, August 11, 2011 at Des Peres Hospital in St. Louis County, Missouri after a eight month period of declining health. He was born in Michael, Il. on May 4, 1934 one of four children born to the late Peter & Margaret "Maggie" (Kelly) Roth. He was graduated of Carrollton Community High School, , and married Maxine Scott on Feb. 14, 1954 at St. John's Catholic Church in Carrollton. They immediately made
