William "Bill" F. Stephenson, 88, passed away at 1:05 am Saturday, September 10, 2011, at Alton Memorial Hospital in Alton with his family by his side.

Bill proudly served as the Mayor of the Village of Bethalto from1981 until 1997. He was a member of the Bethalto United Methodist Church, charter member of the Bethalto Sprit Group, a 50 year member of the Masonic Brotherhood, the Bethalto American Legion Post 214 and the Bethalto Rotary Club where he held the honor of being a Paul Harris Fellow.
