Roman Charles "RC" Beiermann Jr., 62, passed away suddenly at 6:30 p.m., Friday, January 13, 2012 after a battle with bladder cancer courageously fought with dignity.

RC was born in Carrollton on July 24, 1949, one of twelve children born to the late Roman Charles & Rita (Heitzig) Beiermann Sr.

He was raised in Jerseyville, and graduated in 1967 from Jersey Community High School. He was a man of solid principles, and based his life on three important values: faith, family & work. He was devoted to all three.
