Margaret Mary Schroeder, 91, of Jerseyville, died at 8:45 a.m., Monday, January 28 2013 at the home of her son, Ron, after a period of declining health. She was born in Hardin on Nov. 28, 1921, one of four children born to the late John B. & Rose (Woelfel) Hagen. Margaret graduated from the Hardin High School, and completed here senior year at Jersey Township High School. She was devoted wife and mother, and after her children were raised, she returned to school, and earned her nursing certificate. She was employed as a LPN at Jersey Community Hospital for 20 years retiring in 1990. Margaret was blessed with a beautiful voice, and was a charter member of the Carrollton Community Chorus. She married Raymond Schroeder on Sept. 2,



1940 at St. Norbert's Catholic Church in Hardin, and together they raised five children, and shared nearly 47 years together before his death on Aug. 1, 1987. She later married Russell L.
