Paul Richard Summers, 68, died at 6:18 p.m., Thursday, July 11, 2013, at his residence.

He was born in Wheatland, Indiana on January 19, 1945, a miracle child, born to the late James Theodore and Edith Mae (Downey) Summers.

After his mothers death when Paul was only four years old, he was raised by his aunt, Hazel, who provided him with a loving and nurturing home and family.

He was preceded in death by his parents, James Theodore and Edith Mae Summers; his beloved aunt, Hazel Parker; and his mother and father-in-law, Nicholas and Francis Akers.
