



Carmen Breeden

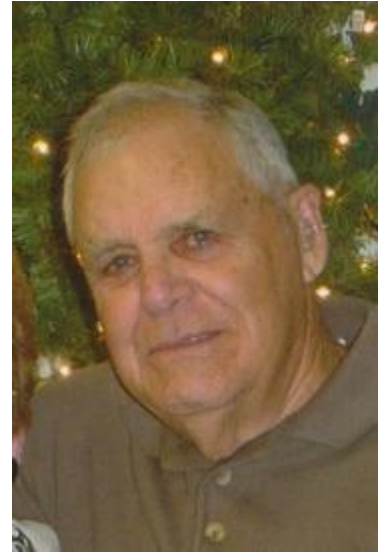
