Our Mom, Elvera Davis, 77, of Rosewood Heights, passed away on November 17, 2013 at home, surrounded by her loving family. This amazing, beautiful person was born, so fittingly, on a magical and snowy Christmas Eve Night, Dec. 24, 1935.
