Charles Andrew Scoggins, 89, met his appointment with death at 4:30 a.m. on Thursday July 10, 2014 at Robbings Manor in Brighton and is now awaiting the judgment as Hebrews 9:27 states “and as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment.” He was born February 23, 1925 in Greene County, IL the son of the late Andrew J. and Forrest W.
