Francis A. Grafford, 85, former Mayor of Kane, died at 7:35 p.m., Friday, September 12, 2014 at Memorial Medical Center in Springfield. He was born in Jerseyville on June 28, 1929, and was the son of the late Elmer & Ella Edna (Lowe) Grafford. He graduated from Jersey Township High School, and served his country with the U.S. Navy. He began working for Ford Motor Company in St. Louis for a short time, and began working at C&W Equipment in Jerseyville as a mechanic. He retired as a shop foreman in 1994 after nearly 30 years of service. He served as Mayor of Kane for 17 years, and was currently serving as a trustee for Kane Township. He was volunteer fireman for the Kane Fire Department for 49 years, and was one of the founders for the former Kane Gun Club. In his "spare" time, he enjoyed hunting, fishing, gardening, traveling, and repairing lawn mowers. He first married the former Mary "Butter" Wright, and together they raised three children, and owned and operated the Kane Kafe. He then married Martha "Marty" Scoggins on Oct. 11, 1985 in Carrollton, and together they have shared nearly 30 years together.
