Edward John Kerkemeyer, 79, of Bethalto, IL, fortified with the sacraments of the Holy Catholic Church, was called by God to eternal rest on Wednesday, October 22 at 10:20 a. m. He was born November 19, 1934; the fifth of seven children of Edward Andrew and Ottilia Rose (Straubinger) Kerkemeyer. On June 21, 1958, he married Joan Arlene Leady at Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church in Alton, IL, and she survives.

He served in the Air Force from 1957 to 1961 as an airplane mechanic, receiving an Honorable Discharge. He worked at Olin Corp. from 1961 to 1999, retiring as a tool and die developer where he was fondly remembered as “the milkman”. He was also a member of the International Association of Machinists.

In 2006, he joined the Knights of Columbus, and supported God and parish as a 4th degree knight. He served as a St. Vincent De Paul member of Our Lady Queen of Peace Church. He also volunteered with his wife for AARP as a tax preparer for senior citizens.

His hobbies included gardening, woodworking, playing cards and games with the family, volunteering, and maintaining vehicles and mowers. He believed in the power of praying the rosary. He will be missed as a loving and strong role model for all of his family and friends.
